

DOCUMENTS

The International Regulatory Development Partnership (IRDP) has developed generically applicable documents that meet the needs of small countries with emerging nuclear power programs. These documents provide three types of requirements or guidance:

1. regulatory planning documents
2. regulatory infrastructure guidance
3. regulatory program documentation

TRAINING

The IRDP provides training to regulatory agencies on key safety and regulatory concepts. The broad range of training topics encompasses three main categories:

1. nuclear fundamentals
2. agency infrastructure development
3. regulatory program development

BILATERAL SUPPORT

With bilateral support from the IRDP, in-country regulators utilize partnership elements by doing the following:

1. preparing and maintaining an action plan for regulatory development
2. tailoring generic documents for in country conditions
3. developing a strategic plan for agency organization and staff recruitment
4. training staff (through The IRDP and other opportunities)
