## Plain Writing Act of 2010

First time U.S. made plain writing requirement a law.

(Not criminal; no penalties.)

**Mostly for federal benefits and services**

**(Also, how to comply with general federal requirements)**

**At the NRC, we apply plain writing standards to:**

- Performance Assessments
- Generic Communications
- Inspection Reports
- Significant Enforcement Actions

*When documents are necessarily technical, we use executive summaries.*

Writing in plain language is supported by the NRC Values and Principles of Good Regulation. These include:

- “Clarity”
- “Openness”
- “Transparency”
- “Service”
- “Respect”

**An example of “not plain writing” at the NRC and how we fix it.**

**Noun/Adjective Cluster**

**Before**

“... a through-wall leak was identified in the body of a *Reactor Core Isolation Cooling System Steam Supply Inboard Isolation Bypass Warmup Valve.*”  
(12 nouns/adjectives in a row!)

**After**

“... a bypass isolation valve for steam supply to Reactor Core Isolation Cooling.”

**More “not plain writing.”**

**Unnecessarily complex/obscure terms.**

**“energetic disassembly” = a fire**

**“high intensity heat event” = an explosion**

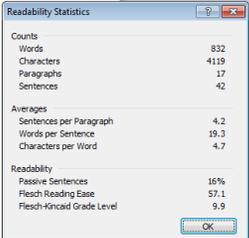
